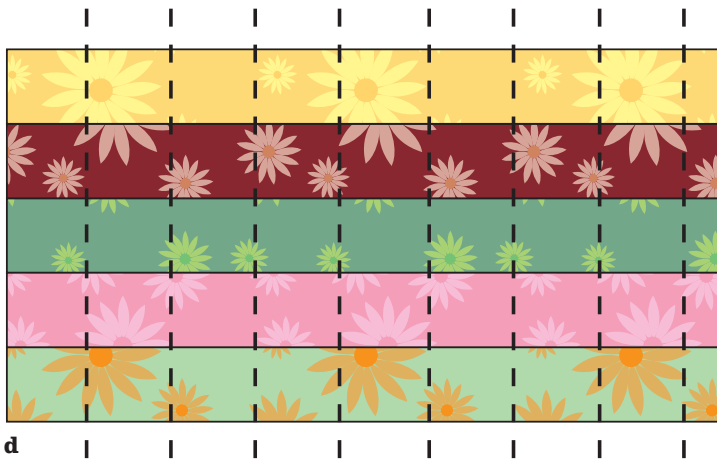
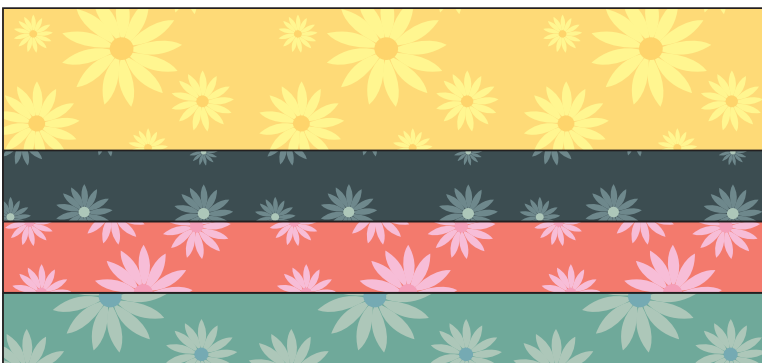


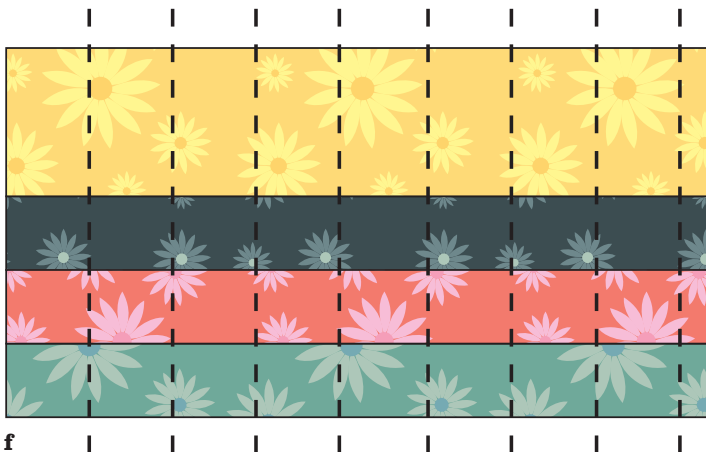

Sewing strip unit B

3. Choose four fabric strips and one 2½in background strip and sew them into strip unit B as shown in diagram c. Press the seams as shown. Repeat to create a total of twelve (six) strip unit Bs.

4. Lay one strip unit B on the cutting mat at a time. Trim selvedge and sub-cut into eight 2½in segments in just the same way as for strip unit A (see diagram d). You need 96 (48) unit B segments in total.

Sewing strip unit C

5. Choose three fabric strips and one 4½in background strip and sew them into strip unit C as shown in diagram e. Press the seams as shown. Repeat to create a total of twelve (six) strip unit Cs.

6. Lay one strip unit C on the cutting mat at a time. Trim the selvedge and sub-cut into eight 2½in segments, just as you did for strip units A and B (see diagram f). You need 96 (48) unit C segments in total.

7. Put unit A, unit B and unit C segments into three piles, making sure the background fabric always faces the same way.

Tip

Do not try to save time by cutting more than one strip unit at a time. You will be in trouble later if you do not cut at a right angle.
