Page no.	Errata
9	<p>Weft Should read: <b>Weft: The yarn or set of yarns that are worked through the warp threads in a horizontal manner.</b></p>
57	<p>Step 18 Should read: <b>Renumber cords 1 to 8. Make cord 1 a holding cord, bring it down 10cm left to right and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 2–8. This creates negative space 3 that will be used as the warp for your weave in step 30.</b></p>
72	<p>Step 44 Should read: <b>Make cord 8 a holding cord, bring it down right to left and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 1–7. You will now have created negative space 2 that will be used as the warp for your weave in step 84.</b></p>
74	<p>Step 53 Should read: <b>Make cord 73 a holding cord, bring it down left to right and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 74–80. You will now have created negative space 3 that will be used as the warp for your weave in step 83.</b></p>
94	<p>Steps 3 and 4 Should read: <b>3. Directly beneath your row of twenty-four reverse lark's head knots, tie a row of six 16-cord half knots using four working cords on either side and eight filler cords in the middle.</b></p>

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	<b>4. Alternate cords (see Essential Terminology) and tie a row of five 16-cord half knots using four working cords on either side and eight filler cords in the middle.</b>
104	<p>Step 3 Should read: <b>3. Undo the temporary overhand knot you made in step 1. Take the two ends of the holding cord together with one cord from the left-hand side and one cord from the right-hand side and tie these four cords into a tight square knot.</b></p> <p>Step 11 Should read: <b>11. Separate the cords into twelve groups of four cords each.</b></p>

108	<p>Step 16 Should read: <b>16. Your ring is now clearly divided into eight sections. Working on the bottom five sections only, fill them by mounting six 1m (31/4ft) lengths of 5mm (3/16in) cotton rope in each section (using a reverse lark's head knot), starting with coloured rope and using natural rope in alternating sections. Fill any gaps by mounting extra pieces of the relevant cord where needed.</b></p>
