9	<p>Weft Should read: Weft: The yarn or set of yarns that are worked through the warp threads in a horizontal manner.</p>
57	<p>Step 18 Should read: Renumber cords 1 to 8. Make cord 1 a holding cord, bring it down 10cm left to right and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 2–8. This creates negative space 3 that will be used as the warp for your weave in step 30.</p>
58	<p>Note should read: Note: If you wish, you can tie the ends of the belt tightly across the bottom of your clothes rack so the warp (hemp) cords of the negative spaces are taut for weaving. Attach the belt buckle to a clothes rack.</p>
72	<p>Step 44 Should read: Make cord 8 a holding cord, bring it down right to left and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 1–7. You will now have created negative space 2 that will be used as the warp for your weave in step 84.</p>
74	<p>Step 53 Should read: Make cord 73 a holding cord, bring it down left to right and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 74–80. You will now have created negative space 3 that will be used as the warp for your weave in step 84.</p>
79	<p>Step 16 should read: Make cord 19 a holding cord, bring it down right to left and tie diagonal double half hitches onto it with cords 12-17</p>
94	<p>Steps 3 and 4 Should read:</p>

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	<p>3. Directly beneath your row of twenty-four reverse lark's head knots, tie a row of six 16-cord half knots using four working cords on either side and eight filler cords in the middle.</p> <p>4. Alternate cords (see Essential Terminology) and tie a row of five 16-cord half knots using four working cords on either side and eight filler cords in the middle.</p>
104	<p>Step 3 Should read: 3. Undo the temporary overhand knot you made in step 1. Take the two ends of the holding cord together with one cord from the left-hand side and one cord from the right-hand side and tie these four cords into a tight square knot.</p> <p>Step 11 Should read: 11. Separate the cords into twelve groups of four cords each.</p>

108	The steps specify using a split ring, but this can be an ordinary, full ring. Has been corrected to 'ring' in later editions.
108	<p>Step 16 Should read: 16. Your ring is now clearly divided into eight sections. Working on the bottom five sections only, fill them by mounting six 1m (31/4ft) lengths of 5mm (3/16in) cotton rope in each section (using a reverse lark's head knot), starting with coloured rope and using natural rope in alternating sections. Fill any gaps by mounting extra pieces of the relevant cord where needed.</p>
110	<p>Step 20 should read: 20: Take the four 3m (10ft) lengths of 3mm (1/8in) sisal (to be used as your weft thread) and begin weaving a tabby weave for approx. three rows or 2cm (3/4in). Once a complete row is woven, you will need to weave either over two warp threads or under two so that the second row is sitting in the opposite way to the first row.</p>
