Page no.	Errata
24	The original text read: 'To make a front post treble, yarn over and insert your hook at the front and under the post of the designated stitch, from left to right , and back out at the front (A).' This has changed to ' from right to left '. The text should read: <i>'To make a front post treble, yarn over and insert your hook at the front and under the post of the designated stitch, from right to left, and back out at the front (A).'</i>
34	At the end of 'Popcorn stitch sample', the following text has been added: ' <i>This sample is worked in double crochet.</i> '
39	C2C STITCH CHART – this original text said 'start of round' but has been changed to say ' <i>start of row</i> '.
57	Should read: <i>'Rnd 20 - brackets at the end '(12 popcorn, 24 ttr, 24 dtr, 48 tr, 24 htr, 12 ch)'</i>
73	Should read: <i>'Row 1: dc 1 in 4th chain from hook. Continue the first row: *1 ch, sk 1 ch, dc 1 in the next stitch; rep from * across...'</i>
105	New text ' <i>Turn the work</i> ' has been added after 'Place RS together and use whip stitch (see Finishing Up: Joining Motifs and Edges) to join the side edges together.'
117	Should read: <i>'To keep the project manageable, this design mostly uses two colours when colour changing is needed.'</i>
125	LOG CABIN GRANNY SQUARE CHART - the + symbol and its label have both been removed from the chart.
145	Steps 1-3 – should read: <i>'1. When you reach the end of a round, cut the yarn leaving a long tail and draw it through the last stitch, as you would do normally for fastening off. 2. Thread a tapestry needle with the yarn tail and bring it under the top of the 'V' of the first stitch in the round, from front to back (G). 3. Bring the needle back into the last stitch (H) – you'll see this mimics the top 'V' of a finished crochet stitch, and now you can weave in the yarn end (I).'</i>
146	The original text read: 'If the number of stitches doesn't match the specified gauge, change your hook size as follows: if the number is too few, try a larger hook; too many, then a smaller one will help.' This should actually be the other way around – you need a smaller hook if too few stitches and a larger hook for too many stitches. The text should read:
